7:33pm Oxycontin / pharmaceutical abuse in San Diego (Matt Williams)

- Trend is for more use of “safer” prescription drugs
- 2nd most abused drugs behind marijuana
- Teens 12 – 17 2nd highest use rate
- Media use / press is rampant, portrayed as easy, fun and safe
- Played a video showing the wide, cavalier attitude on you-tube

- Noted that there are Oxy Task Force educational items on face book and twitter.
- Age range focused 16 - 24, started in upper middle class, but now everywhere... *"All the "popular kids" are using it"*
- Played an interview of his first two informants in November 2008.
- Areas already hit: many cities back east as the most or 2nd most drug problem
- Statistics (used Florida coroner data to start).. over 6 months.. 39 deaths due to methamphetamine... but 890 deaths due to oxyconton.. In SD there are around 45 deaths per year in the county.. hard to test for, unless specifically requested... prescription drugs playing a larger part in traffic deaths
- Prefer to smoke it... besides the easy pills..
- Withdrawals can be worse than heroin!
- What should parents look for... withdrawn from family, loss of interest in previous important event, drop in academic / school performance, loss of motivation / always being tired, finds ways to get away / out of the house, money issues - become manipulative, items missing from the house, stories that don't make sense, physical symptoms are slow to appear (so believe folks who mention changes) check their internet history - who are they talking too? What's in their rooms, closets... *Biggest thing to DO... TALK to your kids!!!*
