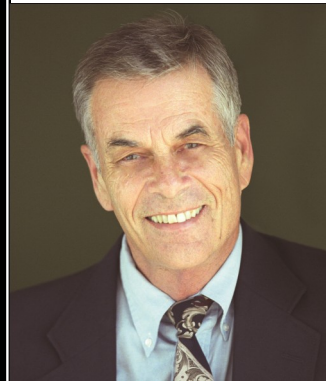


# Mira Mesa Town Council

November brings another election to San Diego, and this month's speaker represents a non-profit elections reform organization. With our meeting falling the evening before the election, "Neighborhoods for Clean Elections" brings its message of campaign finance reform to Mira Mesa.

Additionally, the Mira Mesa Town Council will be hosting two elections of its own. This month we begin accepting nominations for the 2010 Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year. Election of our 2011 Mira Mesa Town Council Board of Directors is also scheduled for Monday. November is starting off as a very busy month!

## Neighborhoods for Clean Elections - John Hartley, Chairman



As another election draws near, Neighborhoods for Clean Elections is bringing its message of campaign finance reform to local communities.

The San Diego campaign for Clean Elections was initiated in the 1990s by local activist Francoise Farron. Under her leadership, the Alliance for Clean Elections was formed.

In 2005, Neighborhoods for Clean Elections was formed as a grassroots coalition of groups and individuals who came together in a renewed campaign to initiate Clean Elections in the City of San Diego.

Neighborhoods for Clean Elections has created a Clean Elections Ballot Initiative, available at the organization's website ([www.sdcleanelections.org](http://www.sdcleanelections.org)), which the group hopes to see on the November 2012 general election ballot. Chairman John Hartley will be with us this meeting to discuss this initiative and their current programs for San Diego candidates.

John Hartley, current Chairman of Neighborhoods for Clean Elections, is a former San Diego City Councilmember. A retired teacher, Mr. Hartley has also served as chairman of Partners for Safe Neighborhoods and as president of the Friends of Kensington/Normal Heights Library. He has been honored for his work as a Sierra Club Volunteer of the Year.

**Will Mira Mesa become San Diego's Ninth City Council District?**

On Tuesday, June 8, San Diego residents voted to permanently adopt the "Strong Mayor" form of government with which we had been experimenting since 2006. Prior to this change, San Diego was governed by eight City Council members and a hired City Manager, with the Mayor serving as the ninth vote on issues brought before the City Council. Now that we have made permanent the change to a chief executive officer/legislative body organization, we are left with only eight votes on the city council.

The Strong Mayor initiative also provided for the creation of a ninth City Council district. The 2010 Redistricting Committee, composed of seven San Diego residents chosen by a panel of three judges, has been selected and empowered to determine the new boundaries for these nine districts.

During the 2000 Decennial Redistricting process, several neighborhoods were nearly divided between two or more city council districts. Mira Mesa was one of these neighborhoods, with the 2000 commission proposing that the eastern and western areas of our community be assigned to different city council districts. It was only due to some last minute efforts that all of Mira Mesa was contained in a single council district - our current District 5.

In anticipation of the creation of a ninth council district, urban planners and other experts have analyzed the population trends of the City of San Diego, and come to an important conclusion: the new, ninth city council district could be dominated by the community of Mira Mesa. With an estimated population of 80,000 people, Mira Mesa contains more than half of the population required for a council district (currently estimated to be around 150,000 people per district).

Because of our past experience with the city's Redistricting Commission, and experts' predictions about the important place Mira Mesa will have in this process, the Mira Mesa Town Council has created an MMTC Redistricting Committee. The committee's task will be to follow the city proceedings, report its progress to the membership, and represent the interests of the Mira Mesa community at city meetings.

Committee members have already attended the selection meeting as well as the first meeting of the city's Redistricting Commission, and presented the commissioners with our stance: ONE MIRA MESA—ONE DISTRICT

At the November meeting of the Mira Mesa Town Council, the MMTC Redistricting Committee will bring our membership up-to-date on the city's activities and discuss the committee's approach to the process. We hope you will join us to learn more about this once in a lifetime opportunity for our community to be recognized for its importance to the city of San Diego.

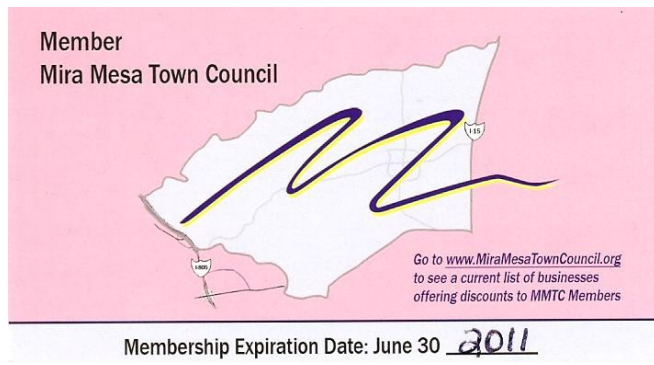

**Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year Nominations Due**

Each year since 1984 the Mira Mesa Town Council has held an annual dinner to recognize special volunteers who make this community a better place. The exact date of the annual Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year Dinner has varied over the years. Recently, MMTC members have voted in December or January to select a Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year for the preceding year, and the Volunteer of the Year Dinner has been held in late winter or early spring.

2009 Volunteer of the Sandy Smith was honored at a dinner in May 2010. The annual dinner is also a fundraiser for MMTC's Verne Goodwin Scholarship Fund, which awards college scholarships to graduating high school seniors who have been involved with community service. Contributions to the MMTC Scholarship Fund in honor of the Volunteer of the Year are encouraged.

Mira Mesa Town Council members and the community at large are now invited to submit their nominations for the 2010 Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year. (See nomination form in the November newsletter or download it from MMTC website.) The due date is November 5, 2010 (Friday after the November MMTC meeting). Mail or email your nominations to Jeff Stevens (jeffstev@san.rr.com), or return your nomination form in person at the MMTC meeting.

Brief biographies of nominees will be published in the December 2010 MMTC newsletter. MMTC members will vote to select the 2010 Mira Mesa Volunteer of the Year at the December MMTC meeting on Monday, December 6, 2010.

The Volunteer of the Year need not be a Mira Mesa Town Council member, but should be someone who has made a significant contribution to Mira Mesa through volunteer work, not just during the past year but over the years s/he has been involved with the community.

In February 1995 MMTC members adopted standing rules for the "Volunteer of the Year" award specifying that MMTC policy would be to have MMTC members vote on Volunteer of the Year nominees submitted by members and the public. Prior to that, the MMTC Board made the selection from submitted nominations, except for 1989, when a vote of the membership was held. In addition, the rules adopted in 1995 stated that MMTC policy would be to select only one Volunteer of the Year and to not select an honoree who has previously been Volunteer of the Year.

**President's Message**

Some of you may have heard that I was selected as a alternate for the redistricting Commission. Seven members of the Commission (and seven alternates) were chosen on October 1 by a panel of Superior Court judges. It appears that those chosen are bright, responsible, and articulate and will most likely do a splendid job.

The decennial redistricting is a very important job anytime, but this year our San Diego Redistricting Commission has the difficult task of figuring out how to work in a ninth city council district. That will be an awesome challenge.

Some people may remember that the 2000 Redistricting Commission made a concerted effort to divide our community with part in each of two council districts. This effort was thwarted very late in the redistricting process.

To prevent this from happening this time we have formed an MMTC Redistricting Committee which you will hear more about as time goes by. Certainly in this newsletter and at MMTC meetings for the foreseeable future there will be a report from the committee. The sole purpose of this committee is to advocate keeping Mira Mesa, all of Mira Mesa, in a single council district. To that end the committee will monitor the redistricting process and advise members if there is any chance that our community will be split between two or more council districts. Members of the committee will attend all Redistricting Commission meetings and will speak in favor of keeping Mira Mesa as well as other communities wholly within individual city council districts. If you are interested in this issue please contact Bari Vaz to join the Committee.

Bari has already spoken twice on this subject in our behalf and requested that the Commission be provided with accurate maps depicting the boundaries of San Diego's "recognizable communities", and that Mira Mesa not be divided.

Changing the subject, everyone is fully aware by now of the City's financial plight. In short, there is little money available. This means that in some cases we the people have to do things for ourselves rather than looking to City Hall for solutions. Recently MMTC was asked to pay for the repair of two donated Police bicycles that are used to police some of our community events and to patrol Mira Mesa Market Center parking lots around the holidays. This is truly a worthy cause that benefits us all so on that basis I said I would bring the proposition to the MMTC membership. Unfortunately, we just learned that the bicycles, each valued at around \$500, are in very bad shape—so bad, in fact, that it is probably unwise to repair them. So it seems that we are now talking about donating bicycles to the Police Department to help make Mira Mesa safer and to reduce the vehicle thefts at Mira Mesa Market Center. Please reflect on this and be ready to add your thoughts at the meeting on Monday, November 1 at the Senior Center.

So here comes Halloween! Don't forget to visit Monster Manor in the Mira Mesa Shopping Center parking lot. This is one of the best haunts in the entire area—something not to be missed. Also don't forget that there are several days of "Lite Frite", a comical substitute for the horror of the night performances, intended specially for the kids.

**Fluorescent Light Recycling Program for San Diego Businesses**

To help local small businesses recycle properly, the San Diego County Department of Environmental Health is making up to 2,200 postage-paid "mail-back" recycling kits available. Each kit can hold up to 75 fluorescent bulbs or tubes, and businesses can simply mail the kit back free of charge to let the County recycle the lights. Businesses are allowed two kits apiece, while the supplies last. To qualify, businesses must be located within San Diego County.

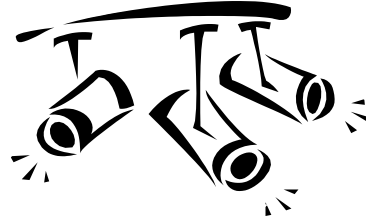

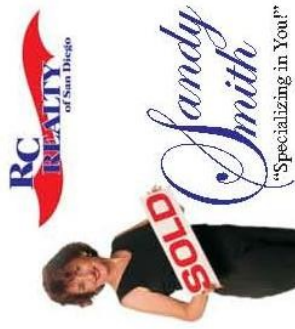
