# **Volunteer of Year Nominees**

Each year since 1984 the Mira Mesa Town Council has held an annual dinner to recognize special volunteers who make this community a better place. The Volunteer of the Year is someone who has made a significant contribution to Mira Mesa through volunteer work, not just during the past year but over the years s/he has been involved with the community. This year the following volunteers have been nominated for this award:

Tom Derr — Tom Derr has been an active volunteer with the Mira Mesa Town Council and other community organizations for many years. He served on the MMTC Board of Directors for two years, and has been chair of the Mira Mesa Maintenance Assessment District Committee for the last seven years. That committee controls an annual budget of \$800.000 that is used to im-

prove and maintain landscaping on major streets such as Mira Mesa Boulevard.

Tom moved to Mira Mesa in 1974. He was the owner/operator of Tom's Master Mechanics from 1984 until his retirement in June 2011. Tom joined the Automotive Service Council (ASC) in 1985 and served as treasurer.

In 1996, he joined the San Diego Herpetological Society, and has served as treasurer of that organization from then until now. Tom is well known for bringing his snakes to the Mira Mesa Street Fair and other community events. SDHS also brings reptiles to schools, especially those with at-risk kids, to spark their interest in learning. Tom is now in the process of starting a new nonprofit business called EcoVivarium, which will be a Zoo for all reptiles, amphibians, and some insects.

Tom is an active member and past president of the Ex-

## Give Your Education Views in National Speak Up Survey

San Diego Unified School District is encouraging parents and students along with teachers and staff to participate in a survey on educational issues. Findings are summarized and shared with national and state policy makers.

This year marks the 10th time the national Speak Up survey has asked students about how they use — and how they would like to use — technology for learning. This year, students will be asked about their use of mobile tools, social networks and gaming as part of their learning in and out of the classroom.

Teachers and administrators will be asked what tools they use and what they want to use and how prepared they are for technology use, and parents will be asked how they feel about the role of technology in their children's lives and

learning.

The national online Speak Up 2012 survey is open now until Dec. 21.

The survey is a series of multiple choice questions, plus students will also be given the chance this year, through two open-ended questions, to "brief the President" on their ideas for improving education and to describe how they would make one of their classes more interesting and valuable if technology was better used in that class.

The Speak Up online survey will be completed by more than 400,000 K-12 students, educators and parents around the country. The results provide important insights about education, technology and student aspirations that are used every year by individual schools, districts, state departments of education and national leaders.

"We are excited to look at how students' responses have changed over the last decade, and to look at how the responses have changed from those who were 7-years-old the first time they took the Speak Up survey and who are now seniors in high school," said Julie Evans, president and CEO of Project Tomorrow, the organization that conducts the Speak Up survey. "Ten years ago, we were asking about email accounts. Last year, we were talking about students designing and using gaming to learn. That's a huge shift.'

To take the survey, go to www.speakup4schools.org/speakup2012/, select your school and use the secret word **SURF**.

Since 2003, more than 2.6 million K-12 students, educators and parents from more than 30,000 schools in all 50 states have participated in Speak Up.

The Mira Mesa Cluster Council, which represents all Mira Mesa schools from K-12, meets on the fourth Monday of every month at 5:30 p.m. at the Media Center of Mira Mesa High School. Besides parents, teachers and staff, all community groups are encouraged to send a representative to these meetings.

Julius Hitchens — Julius Hitchens has been involved with the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO) Region 285 of Mira Mesa for more than 15 years. He has held several positions within the organization, such as Coach Administrator and Division Coordinator, and currently sits on the Board of Directors as Assistant Regional Commissioner.

He has also been a referee for AYSO soccer games. Mira Mesa AYSO plays host to one of the largest soccer tournaments in the region, the Top Gun Tournament, held annually on Memorial Day weekend, where Julius can be seen as Top Gun Tournament Director and Coach.

Both his boys (BU19) and

girls (GU19) teams brought home championship medals in the 21st Annual Top Gun Tournament. Julius has spent the past 8 years coaching the Mira Mesa High School Boys Varsity and JV Soccer teams and 7 years coaching the Mira Mesa High School Boys and Girls Golf teams. Julius has volunteered as a member of the Board of the Tiburon Homeowners Association for the last nine years. Julius and his family have resided in Mira Mesa for 18 years and run a family business at Top Gun Realty.

Bari Vaz — Bari Vaz moved to Mira Mesa from New Orleans in 2008 and rapidly became a leader in most of our community groups. She serves as Chairman of the Mira Mesa Community Planning Group, and previously chaired a Planning Group subcommittee that reviewed the future high occupancy vehicle onramp to Interstate 15, working for months to develop mitigation plans. Bari serves as First

Vice-President of the Mira Mesa Town Council. She chaired the Town Council Redistricting Subcommittee, attending almost all of the City Redistricting Committee meetings, with her efforts leading to a result beneficial to our community. She has chaired the Mira Mesa Fourth of July committee for the past two years, and represented Mira Mesa as an Ambassador for the San Diego Foundation's "Our Greater San Diego Vision.'

Bari is a leader in creating the new MMTC Foundation, a tax-deductible non-profit now under formation as a sister group to Mira Mesa Town Council. Bari also serves on the board of the Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch Retired Senior Volunteer Program, Inc. and as Chairman of the Mira Mesa Chamber of Commerce. Bari lived in New Orleans prior to coming to Mira Mesa and was just as active in that community, among other efforts helping residents with the recovery from Hurricane Katrina.
