On Wednesday, May 9, 2012, at 7 p.m. the Mira Mesa Town Council will host a Mayoral Forum. The forum will focus on issues that are important to the residents of Mira Mesa.

The forum will be held at Mira Mesa High School Auditorium. There will be a small reception at 6:30 p.m. before the forum.

The candidates participating in the forum are Congressman Bob Filner, and Assemblyman Nathan Fletcher. City Council Member Carl DeMaio and District Attorney Bonnie Dumanis were invited but could

not participate because of scheduling conflicts.

Hoa Quach, the associate regional editor for AOL Patch, and Jacqui Nguyen, a freelance reporter, will moderate the forum.

The Mayoral Forum aims to inform the residents of Mira Mesa about each of the mayoral candidates' perspectives on issues facing our community.

The audience will be comprised of Mira Mesa business owners, members of the military, nonprofit leaders, community leaders, education leaders, parents, students and faculty from Mira Mesa High School.

Candidates will respond to questions from town council members, MMHS faculty and students, and those in the audience.

Fireworks Show Will Go On With A Whimper

The Mira Mesa/Scripps Ranch 4th of July Fireworks Extravaganza, a 37-year tradition, will continue in 2012 but will be smaller than in past years due to a shortfall in funding.

Scripps Mesa Fireworks, the 501(c) 3 charity behind the show, needs \$24,000 to continue the traditional fireworks show, which is approximately 20 minutes in length and synchronized to music provided on KYXY radio. The group was presented with an April 5 deadline to sign a contract and submit a deposit of nearly \$12,000. By

Thursday, \$10,930 of the \$24,000 had been raised. This amount is not enough to pay the down payment on the large scale show.

Scripps Mesa Fireworks has committed to pay \$12,000 for the 2012 show. That amount will pay for a fireworks show of approximately half the size of the usual show — 10 minutes instead of 20, and with no music accompanying the fireworks.

If \$16,000 is raised, the show will be extended to 15 minutes in length and music will be broadcast

from a sound system near the fireworks site along Mira Mesa Blvd.

If the originally required \$24,000 is raised by May 4, the customary size of the show and KYXY-synchronized music can be restored.

Since 1994 we have volun-

teered 170,409 hours. This year we have logged 3,574 hours. We have 48 members and need to grow. Our volunteers help our community.

San Diego Unified Embraces Technology in The Classroom

The San Diego Unified School District continues to move forward with its implementation of Vision 2020 for Educational Excellence. At the time we adopted it in 2009 the Class of 2020 was in first grade.

Now they are in fourth grade. In spite of ongoing budget woes, we have continued forward with our plans to transform our local educational system as the Class of 2020 moves through the system.

One key element of the program Vision 2020 is the use of state-of-the-art technology in the classroom.

We are in the third year of a five year rollout of our i-21 program, which will place a laptop or other device in the hands of every student in the district.

I-21 also includes smartboards and other classroom technology.

San Diego has become a nationally recognized leader for educational technology.

I visited a middle school math classroom whose teachers were trained in the technology. As students worked on math problems on their net-books, the teacher was able to see instantly which students were having difficulties with a problem.

She then tailored the instruction for them. Another math teacher places all of his lessons online for his students to review at home and is able to give more individual assistance in the classroom.

At the high school level some students who are behind in credits are taking courses online. We even have a virtual high school, I-High.

Classroom technology continues to change at a rapid pace. This spring we have authorized the

purchase of I-pads for some classrooms. We will need to continue to adapt to new innovations.

Our technology program was a key element of Proposition S, approved by voters in 2008. No general operating funds are used for this program.

We will eventually see cost savings as we move to more online textbooks. In years past we have spent millions of textbook updates. They will be updated online at a lower cost.

It is also interesting to note that another school district that issued laptops to students had a lower dollar cost due to damage or loss than they had with textbooks.

Watch for other innovations in the school district as the Class of 2020 progresses towards graduation. San Diego Unified will continue to be a national leader in innovation in education.

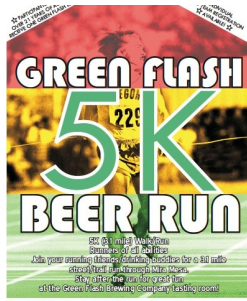
Audition dates are May 9 and May 17, from 6 p.m. to 9 p.m. at the EpiCentre in Mira Mesa.

Volunteer of the Year (Pam and Christina)

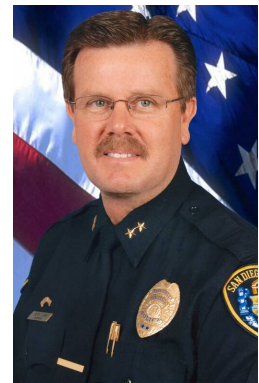
- Talked about the VOY dinner invitation going out soon. The dinner honoring Judy Taylor will be held on Sat., May 5. Tickets \$35/person.
