## President's Message -Ted Brengel-

There are many things going on in Mira Mesa lately. We have the invasion of the dockless vehicles starting with motorized scooters. We'll be hearing from that group at the MMTC meeting on February 4<sup>th</sup>. There is progress on the last major addition to Mira Mesa: the 3Roots Project, and the City is considering some very important changes in the rules regarding parking requirements for major projects.

The dockless vehicles just appeared a few months ago. Personally, I believe that we really have almost no chance to consider their ramifications. On one hand, many people are really enjoying the scooters, mostly the younger set. On the other hand, they are a royal pain when they are left on sidewalks and on private property which happens all too often. I urge everyone to give this some thought. Do you think we should even have the so-called "dockless" vehicles around, or should they be outlawed? If you want them, what sort of rules should there be about who can ride them? What sort of safety equipment should be required? And where can they be operated and stored? Do the "sharrow" provisions made for bicycles pertain to the scooters as well? Now is our chance to say something and ask hard questions. If we remain silent, I have a feeling the scooters will be just about everywhere and there will be few rules.

The 3Roots Project is taking shape. This is the addition to Mira Mesa that will fill the west end of Carroll Canyon and provide our third community park and space for one more recreation center. The area was a mine operated by Hanson Aggregates for many years. *Continued on Page 5>>>>>*

## MMTC Meeting Feb. 4 to Feature Discussion of Dockless Scooters

What are the current rules about the use of dockless scooters, which suddenly seem to be everywhere in San Diego, Mira Mesa included? What rules should there be? A discussion of dockless scooters will be the featured topic at the February Mira Mesa Town Council meeting. Sophie Beckerman of Bird Scooters, the company most involved with the Mira Mesa area, will be at the meeting and answer questions about how they operate their scooter business. The meeting will take place Monday, February 4, 7pm in the Mira Mesa Library community room, 8405 New Salem Street, San Diego CA 92126.

The City of San Diego is in the process of reviewing its regulations about dockless scooters. At the January 14 MMTC meeting San Diego City Councilmember Chris Cate said the San Diego City Council Public Safety Committee gave direction to develop regulations for dockless scooters and bicycles. Those regulations would include no sidewalk riding; one person at a time; and helmet not required (for riders over age 18).



At the MMTC Board meeting Jan. 14, Board members came up with the following questions for the Bird Scooters representative to address:

What are the current regulations and proposed regulations?

How are the locations for the scooter drop-offs determined?

How are scooters left away from drop locations retrieved?

How are scooters kept off the sidewalks and roads?

What is use by over/under 18?

Can community define areas where they can be left?

Idea: Trade Electric box area cleanup for use?

In other business Feb. 4, MMTC treasurer Jonathan Lea will present a draft MMTC budget for 2019. MMTC members will vote on adoption of the final budget at the March MMTC meeting.

There will also be a sign-up sheet at the Feb. 4 meeting for MMTC members who can volunteer a couple hours at MMTC's Mira Mesa community information booth at the upcoming Tet Festival in Mira Mesa Community Park Feb. 8 – 10.

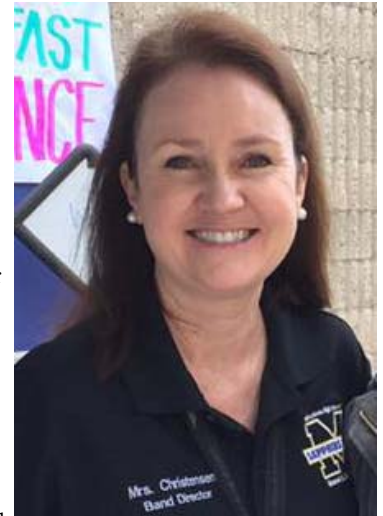

## Mira Mesa Community Planning Group to Hold Elections March 18

The Mira Mesa Community Planning Group (MMCPG) is one of our most important community groups, providing the opportunity for local residents and businesses to have input into the future development of our community. The MMCPG has the responsibility to write (with the aid of the City) the Mira Mesa Community Plan, recommend changes to the Community Plan, and evaluate projects as they are proposed for consistency with the Community Plan. The Planning Group has 11 residential, 5 business and 3 property owner members. We are currently performing the first major update to the Community Plan since 1992.

The MMCPG holds elections every two years, electing half the members each time for four-year terms. If you want to vote for the Planning Group members, or run for a position on the Planning Group, the first step is to come to a meeting and register as an "eligible member of the community." To be eligible you need to be a resident, property owner or business owner (or representative) within the Mira Mesa Community. You can sign up as late as the February 21<sup>st</sup> meeting to be eligible to vote. To run for a position on the Planning Group, you also need to have attended two meetings between November 2017 and January 2019. If you are interested in being on the Planning Group, even if you are not eligible to run now, please go ahead and register. Openings occur often and are then filled by people who have registered and been attending meetings.

## Assemblymember Brian Maienschein Leaves GOP and Joins the Democratic Party

SACRAMENTO –Today, Assemblymember Maienschein announced that he has re-registered as a Democrat.

“Leaving the Republican Party is not easy. I can either keep fighting to change the Republican Party or I can fight for my constituents. I choose to use my energy and skills for the people I represent,” said Maienschein.

Maienschein, a four term Assemblymember, has often been at odds with the Republican Party, voting across party lines.

Assemblymember Maienschein ran for the San Diego City Council in 2000 because he believed that government should help people and wanted to make life better for our community. He prioritized building relationships within the community to help address public service needs to better serve constituents.

“Donald Trump has led the Republican Party to the extreme on issues that divide our country, but his leadership is not the lone reason for my change in party affiliation. I too have changed. As the Republican Party has drifted further right, I – and my votes – have changed. As a single father to two girls I am guided by my hopes and dreams for their future,” explains Maienschein.

“I believe that our children, our families and our communities deserve to be protected above an unencumbered right to own automatic weapons. I believe in supporting businesses; but that the workforce needs protection - and organized labor provides that protection. I believe that health care should be accessible to everyone - no one should have to choose between medicine and buying groceries.

“I believe in the value of life, but I will never allow interference with a woman’s right to choose. I believe that love happens in many forms and no person’s rights should be denied because of who they love. I believe that families come in all shapes and sizes and that’s a good thing. I believe that a person born outside of the US has the right to pursue his or her American dream. And I believe there is no circumstance when a child should be torn from the arms of his or her mother.”

“My reason for serving has never changed, I still believe that government should help people,” says Maienschein. “I will do everything I can to ensure that it will - as a member of the Democratic Party.”
