MMTC Offers Three \$1,000 College Scholarships

The Mira Mesa Town Council is again offering college scholarships based on community service to graduating high school seniors who live in Mira Mesa. The application deadline for this year's Mira Mesa Town Council / Verne Goodwin Scholarship is May 3, 2019. Three \$1,000 scholarships which can be used for community college, college or university, or technical school will be awarded to students based on their involvement with volunteering. The Mira Mesa Town Council is honored to once again present the annual Mira Mesa 4th of July Parade and Family Fun Day in Mira Mesa Community Park. This 45-year tradition allows Mira Mesa to come together in celebration of Independence Day and our rich and diverse community. The day traditionally begins with a Pancake Breakfast at Verne Goodwin Mira Mesa Senior Center, 8460 Mira Mesa Boulevard, from 7 AM to 11 AM, hosted by Black Mountain Masonic Lodge.

The 45th Annual Mira Mesa 4th of July Parade, celebrating “50 Years: A Community for the World,” will step off at 11:30am on Thursday, July 4, 2018, from the corner of Mira Mesa Boulevard and Greenford Drive, traveling down Mira Mesa Boulevard and turning north on Camino Ruiz to end at New Salem.

All interested participants are encouraged to apply: precision marching groups, themed walking groups, bands, floats, decorated cars, car clubs, and more! Parade entry fees are \$60/group. The Best Float Contest is back this year! The prize is \$200 cash.

Family Fun Day in Mira Mesa Community Park opens at 11am, with a variety of food and other vendors serving families who make a day of it in the park. Fun Day continues until the 9pm fireworks display, set off from Mira Mesa High School. The park provides a central location with “front row seats” for the sky show.

Getting the Full Value of Spare Change

As I promised at the meeting, here's the (not so) secret...

You've all seen Coinstar™ machines in our local stores, right? These are brightly colored green machines that will accept your change in exchange for a voucher that you, in turn, exchange for actual cash at the store's service desk or checkout. All you do is carefully guide your coins into the machine. When you indicate you are done, the machine spits out the voucher.

There is just one tiny problem. The machine keeps 11.9 percent of the money you put in. That nice voucher will be 11.9% short when the count is done! Even when it was a paltry ten percent, I just couldn't get myself to fork over all that money for just to have my money counted. I also couldn't seem to find the time to count it and put it in tubes myself. So, over the years, my metallic fortune has grown considerably.

Once upon a time my credit union had change counting machines, but I recently noticed that they are gone. The nice teller at the credit union said that they would refund the percentage that Coinstar took, but for some reason I figured that would be a big hassle, and the coins continued to accumulate. Then, one day, it happened!

I found an article that claimed that you could put your coins into a Coinstar machine and NOT fork over anything. That sounded like one of those scams that are so prevalent these days—just too good to be true. I had to investigate though.

Well, it turns out that if you just take the money and run, you are going to lose the 11.9% every time. On the other hand, if you take just a little time, you can redirect the proceeds of your coin-counting endeavor to one of a large number of places that will either result in a charitable donation by you, or an e-gift card to one of many fine institutions such as Best Buy and Amazon.

While you can go online to Coinstar.com to get all the details, I've listed the charities and retailers to which you can direct the results of your coin deposit here for your convenience. The two Coinstar locations in Mira Mesa are Vons and CVS, both in the Mira Mesa Mall. Both have the same options available however you must choose where your money will go BEFORE you deposit coins in the machine.

The charity options are:

- American Red Cross
- Children's Miracle Network Hospitals
- Feeding America
- Leukemia & Lymphoma Society
- The Humane Society HQ
- UNICEF Relief Fund US Fund
- United Way of America
- World Wildlife Fund

And the retailers gift cards that are available are:

- Amazon.com
- Applebee's Restaurant
- Best Buy
- Game Stop
- Southwest Airlines
- Starbucks
- Steam
- The Home Depot

Here is a brief summary.

When you arrive at the machine, select a retailer or charity. Do not skip this or you'll be giving Coinstar 11.9% of your money.

After the machine confirms your selection, start pouring in the coins.

After all the coins are gone, *check the coin return*, and redeposit any coins that were rejected. If the machine still won't accept them, you'll just have to spend those.

Select "Finished..." on the screen and wait while the machine prints out your gift card (retailers) or receipt (charities). Notice that nothing has been deducted.

Go spend your gift card or make a note of your donation.

One note. The receipt or e-gift card the machine spits out is very perishable, so be sure to use it or make a copy very soon.

Let me know if you encounter any problems with this. I selected Amazon and got a gift card that I added to my Amazon Gift Card Balance. It was quick and easy AND I got rid of all that change.

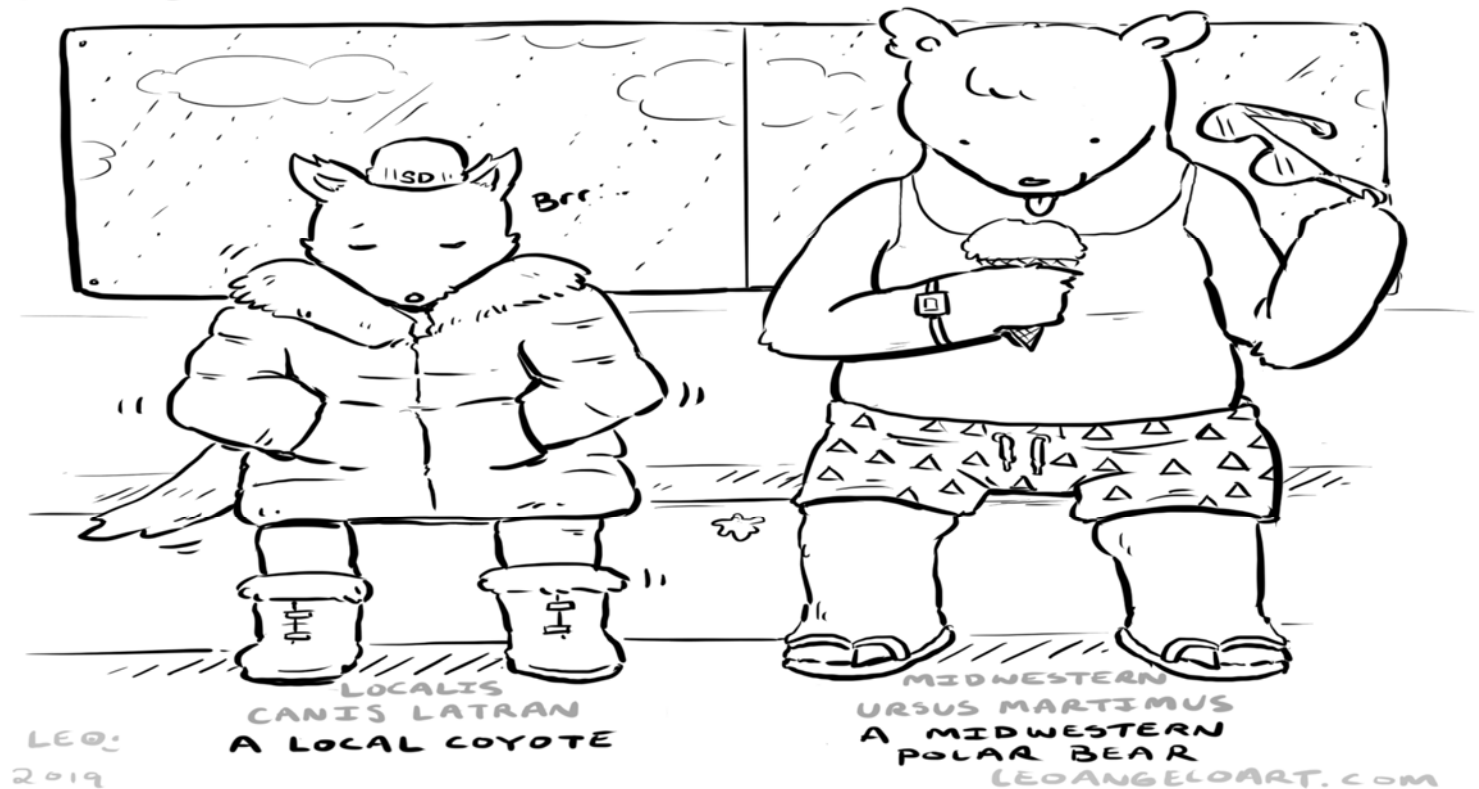
Today, U.S. Congressman [Scott Peters](#) (CA-52) released the following statement after he helped pass the Paycheck Fairness Act, which strengthens current equal pay and civil rights laws to give women more tools to contest unfair pay:

"In 2019, women still earn just 80 cents, on average, for every dollar earned by men. It is past time to give every American equal economic opportunity—regardless of gender. Existing loopholes put women at a disadvantage when negotiating fair pay. The Paycheck Fairness Act improves the Department of Labor's enforcement tools and ensures that any pay disparity is based on legitimate, job-related reasons, and not gender. In my office, male and female employees are paid the same commensurate with experience. I remain a fierce advocate for paycheck equality, and urge the Senate to pass this bill soon to support American women."

The Paycheck Fairness Act also includes the following provisions to strengthen women's pay protections in the workplace:

- Bans employers from using past salary history to determine future pay, stopping pay inequities from trailing women from job to job
- Prohibits employer retaliation against employees who willingly disclose salary details
- Expands opportunities for women to join class-action lawsuits that target nation-wide pay discrimination
