MMTC Meeting May 6th



President's Message -Ted Brengel-

It was a splendid celebration of the wealth of contributions by Jeanne Christensen, the Director of the Mira Mesa High School Sapphire Sound Marching Band. It was a very special occasion for a very special person. Of course, an event like that doesn't just happen. It takes several months of planning and coordination to make sure that all our public office holders get their chance to honor our top volunteer and everything is in place on the appointed evening. The two miracle-workers who put the event together were Christina Keene and Maria Pankau—two of the hardest-working people I ever met. Our Master of Ceremonies was none other than Mark James. Should you ever need a DJ, we can provide his contact info. I think it was an evening that Jeanne will remember for a very long time.

As most of you know, I attend a meeting that is held monthly at MCAS Miramar called the Community Leaders Forum. These meetings are held in the commanding officer's conference room and are intended to keep community leaders informed about the activities and intentions of the Marines at MCAS Miramar. This month the meeting focused on changes that are starting in the next year or so, primarily the arrival of the F-35 Lightning II at Miramar. This new aircraft will eventually replace all the F/A-18's at Miramar, but it will take five or more years to complete the transition. From the USMC perspective, these aircraft will provide an enormous boost in fighting capability. From our perspective, there will be little change in the impact of Miramar operations on surrounding communities. Of course, a new study will be done and provided to the San Diego Planning Department (which includes our own community planning group). The study is called *Air Installations Compatible Use Zones* or AICUZ for short. *(continued on p. 6)*

Unique “Antique Iron with Character” Sculpture Exhibit by Mira Mesan Hilary Paul McGuire Continues Through May at Bread & Salt Art Complex

Hilary Paul McGuire, 81, resident of Mira Mesa, has been making sculptures using pieces of what he calls “Antique Iron with Character” for over 45 years. Hailing from Oklahoma, Hilary was recognized by judges from Boston and New York City in the Oklahoma Annual Exhibition of Art in 1976. He moved to San Diego the same year. McGuire was chosen from over 1,600 artists to be showcased at the San Diego Art Institute’s Annual Exhibitions in 1978 and again in 1980. Since ‘82 he has been raising children and teaching math for the San Diego Community College District, all the while continuing his sculpting in the privacy of his home in Mira Mesa.

On April 13, 2019, McGuire debuted a personal selection of his sculptures at the Athenaeum Art Center inside the Bread & Salt Building in Logan Heights, just east of downtown San Diego. Attendance at this local exhibit will be appreciated by any age from two to 92, because no one has ever seen such an original approach to antique iron, incorporating historical railroad and agricultural parts into deep messages wisdom and old age.

City Council Adopts Mayor Faulconer's Dockless Scooters

New Rules Focus on Slower Speeds, Public Safety and Rider Education While Encouraging More Mobility Options for San Diegans

Today Mayor Kevin L. Faulconer won unanimous City Council approval for new regulations for the dockless mobility industry that require companies to obtain permits and comply with new rules aimed at improving safety, such as limiting speeds in certain public spaces and staging the devices in designated corrals.

The regulations focus on six key areas – speed limits, staging and parking, rider education, data sharing, fees, and indemnification and liability insurance – intended to make the nascent industry more safe and accountable while better integrating the devices into San Diego's transportation landscape.

"The way people get around town has changed quite a bit and we're embracing that by putting in place common-sense rules to protect the quality of life in our neighborhoods," Mayor Faulconer said. "These new regulations allow us to hold these companies accountable for their actions while establishing clear rules of the road to ensure this evolving industry grows in a safe and responsible way."

Mayor Faulconer's regulations go into effect July 1. The program calls for a six-month permit that allows City leaders to hold companies accountable by declining to renew for operators that fail to follow the new rules. To receive a permit, companies will pay a \$5,141 fee and must declare how many scooters and e-bikes they will have in the market for that time period, preventing rapid fluctuations in fleet size throughout the year.

City Councilmember Jennifer Campbell said, "Like many in our beach and bay communities, I'm disappointed the City Council would not consider a ban of electric scooters, e-bikes and other dockless options on our boardwalk. While the rules approved by Council do not go as far as I would like, I'm happy to see some level of regulation and enforcement added to our municipal code. This gives us a baseline of information to work off of and will allow us the opportunity to revisit these regulations at Council if the data we collect suggests they're not working. Finally, to the many District 2 residents that came to City Hall today, thank you for providing the Council with your perspective and experiences and know that I will continue to fight for our beach communities."

City Councilmember Chris Cate said, "I am pleased to see the City adopt sensible regulations for dockless scooters that prioritizes public safety and embraces evolving technology. "Resolving this issue has been one of my top priorities, and I am appreciative that my solutions will be implemented." Key components of the regulations include:

- **Speed Limits:** In specific geofenced areas, operators will slow scooters to 8 mph. Three of the geofenced areas are pedestrian-only and operators will slow scooters to 3 mph with a push message notifying riders to leave that area. Geofencing will be in effect for beach-area boardwalks, Balboa Park, NTC Park, Mission Bay Park, Petco Park and the pedestrian-only locations, including North/South Embarcadero, MLK Jr. Promenade, and La Piazza della Famiglia.

If you would like to see what one is like, just Google "MCAS Miramar AICUZ" to see the current version. As I said, a new one will be prepared for the arrival of the new aircraft.

Just in case you are interested, there are two versions of the F-35 that will be based at MCAS Miramar. The F-35B is the short takeoff/vertical landing (STOVL) variant and is the world's first supersonic STOVL stealth aircraft. While this is the variant that will make the most noise, at Miramar it will be operated as far from communities as possible on specially built pads. The other variant that will be based at Miramar is the F-35C. This is the carrier variant that will be used to operate with Navy units aboard aircraft carriers.

Another piece of news regarding the F-35's is that to a greater extent than ever before, simulators will be used for training, minimizing the number of takeoffs and landings at Miramar. This is mainly due to a dramatic improvement in the ability of simulators over those of the past and the fabulous expense of live flight hours. If you would like additional info on F-35's, there is a wealth of it on the Web.

As I write this May draws near and I can almost feel June graduations (my granddaughter for one) and two important national celebrations coming up fast. The first celebration is a Memorial Day tribute to our veterans being held at the Verne Goodwin Senior Center on May 27 from 10:00 AM until noon. Then comes our 4th of July Celebration which you can read about elsewhere in the newsletter. One thing is certain—Mira Mesa Celebrates America and our place in it. Come out and be part of these celebrations.

That's it for May. I'll have more in June. Have a great Spring!

New Rules for Dockless Scooters *(continued)*

- **Staging:** Operators will no longer be able to stage scooters and e-bikes on sidewalks in Downtown. The City has identified – and is currently installing – 330 on-street dockless parking corrals throughout Downtown where staging is allowed. In the beach areas, operators are only permitted to stage in groups of up to four, with 40 feet in between each group. The City will identify corral locations in the beach areas and, once installed, will require their use. The City also will conduct an evaluation of locations throughout San Diego where designated parking corrals would be beneficial and, working with the City Council and communities, install more.
- **Rider parking:** Operators will prohibit riders from ending a ride in specific geofenced areas, including beach area boardwalks.
- **Education:** Consistent messages about local and state laws in smartphone applications will be required. As will on-device labeling about age requirements and how riding on the sidewalk is illegal.
- **Per Device Fee:** A per device fee of \$150 annually will be assessed. A reduction of \$15 per device will be offered for operators offering a qualified equity program. Equity programs may include discounts, equitable distribution, credit-card free unlock or mobile-device free unlock.
- **Data Sharing:** A variety of data will be shared about ridership, parking, paths of travel and more to assist the City in transportation planning, Climate Action Plan reporting and enforcement.
- **Indemnification/Insurance:** Operators will be required to indemnify the City from liability and to hold a \$2 million per occurrence, \$4 million aggregate and \$4 million umbrella insurance policy.
- **Performance Bond:** Each operator will be required to pay a "Safety Deposit" – \$65 for each device in fleet – to be held in the event the company leaves the market without its devices.
